Ethics 9009 was introduced as a core course in 1986 to acquaint freshmen veterinary students with this issue aring in vacance, medicine clinical prictice. It is presented in the formal of Ethical Grand Rounds, a technique designed to mimic the medical and surgical discussions students will encounter later,

The course exposes students to the conflicts encountered by practitioners. "The six-week course consists of the weekly presentation of a problem, discussion by groups of students and faculty moderators, and a suppression of the viewpoints from the rix discussion groups and the clinician presentes," says Dr. Sheldon Steinberg, one of the course organizers "The problems presented have ranged from the question 'Should research animals be med to train veterinary students' to 'Treatment of the reminal cancer patient: how much, bow far, and how offen.

"We deliberately offer this course early in the atuderas' veterinary training. They can toro in on the ethical issues unhampered by medical facts. Of enume, they are given pertinent medical information within the context of the problem. We want them to he aware that veterinary medicul practice requires judgement and that the leaves discussed in the course are just the beginning of a carect-long concern."
