ScholarlyCommons FY19 Report

ScholarlyCommons (http://repository.upenn.edu/) has served as the University of Pennsylvania's open access institutional repository since 2004. The repository, hosted on Elsevier's bepress Digital Commons software, allows for faculty, students, and Penn researchers to share scholarly materials publicly and without paywalls.

Fiscal Year 2019 (July 1, 2018 - June 30, 2019) was a year of maintenance, as Library-wide strategic planning and other initiatives took precedence over direct repository-related outreach. That being said, the repository still experienced growth consistent with years prior, including new projects, journals, and faculty paper uploads.

The first part of the FY19 report contains a series of charts and graphics illustrating FY19 downloads, uploads, and general repository use. The second part of the report contains brief profiles of new projects and collaborations undertaken by repository staff in FY19. All data for this report was collected in July 2019.


Statistics


Download Statistics

ScholarlyCommons received its highest number of annual downloads in FY19, slightly besting FY18 totals. The graphics and charts below demonstrate the year-over-year growth of repository downloads, as well as the most popular "series," or collections, in the repository all-time. This information demonstrates the wide variety of content types hosted in the repository, as well as the impact open access to faculty research and ETDs, among other materials, has on the general readership at Penn and elsewhere. ScholarlyCommons remains an extremely popular point of access for Penn-produced scholarship.






Upload Statistics

There was a slight uptick in uploads in FY19 over last fiscal year (2,500 in FY19 vs. 2,291 in FY18). The charts below demonstrate the quantity of uploads to the repository, as well as the variety. Overall, uploads have held relatively steady over the past few years.

New Projects and Collections

The ScholarlyCommons team consulted on 18 new digital projects in FY19, 11 of which passed through to completion and publication in the repository. The other seven remain in various stages of the project lifecycle, including "unpursued" or "on hold." The section includes only completed projects.

The projects included in this section are for those which had an initial consultation taking place between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019. Note that some older projects were completed during this time, but the initial consultation took place in FY18 or earlier. Additionally, these projects represent a subset of the overall work that takes place around the repository and does not present a complete picture of "growth" or general interest in our services. For instance, this information does not capture consultations around existing collections, which can be quite substantive.

A more comprehensive set of tools and services to support the wide variety of digital projects taking place on campus would further solidify the Libraries as a valued partner in innovative publishing ventures.
