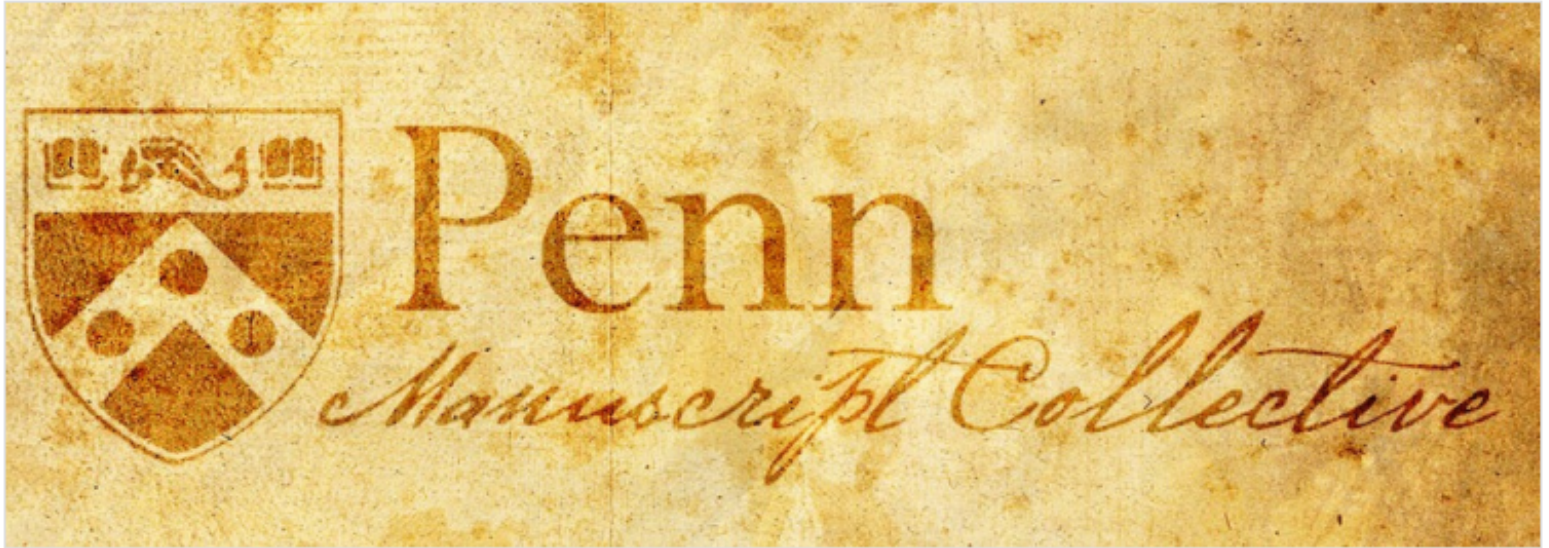

This conference, named for the [Society of the History of Authorship, Reading and Publication](#), will take place from Thursday the 18th until Sunday the 21st. 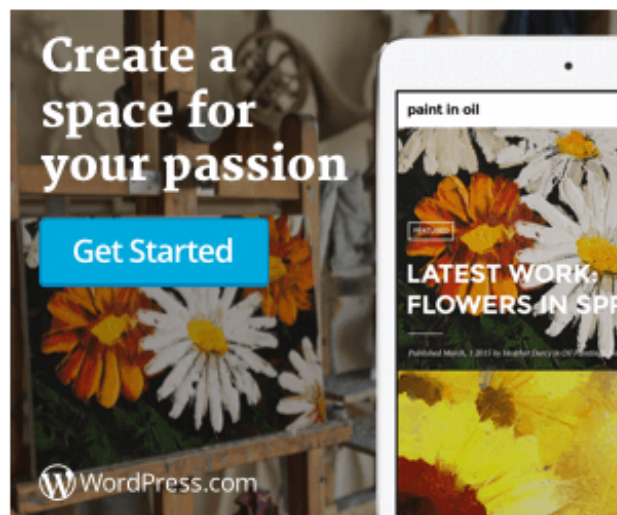
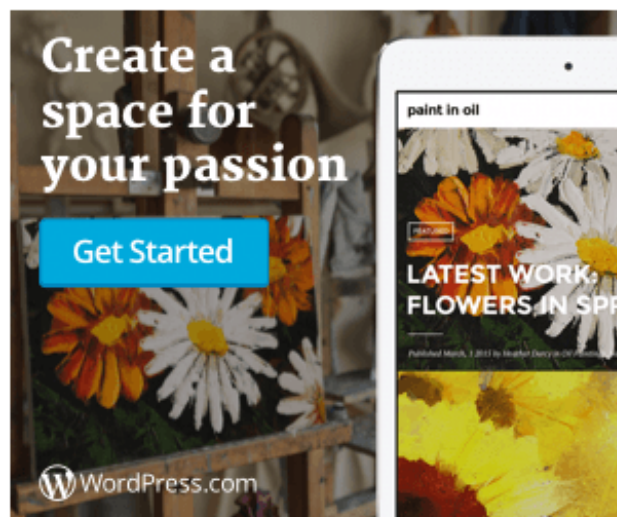

I am excited to hear keynote addresses by [Roger Chartier](#) and [Michael Suarez](#), to listen to a talk on [Printing Narnia](#), to watch my co-worker Jack Wiggins chair a [session](#) and give a [paper](#), and to see [RBML](#) regular [Marissa Nicosia](#) present in the same [lightning talk](#) as my professor [Claire Bourne](#) (who is giving a talk on "[Dramatic Pilcrowes](#)").

A quick update on the research: Nicole and I have now finished transcribing John Rowe Parker's letters from five major early Philadelphia publishers: [George Willig](#), [George E. Blake](#), [George Bacon](#), [Allyn Bacon](#), and [Benjamin Carr](#). As we continue to work, we are looking into platforms and tools like [Omeka](#) or [WordPress Premium](#) to display our letters and transcriptions.
